



If someone was asked for ten words that can be used to describe Mr. David Proux, they could be: giving, sacrifice, devoted, dedicated, enthusiastic, loyal, cost conscious, fun-loving, grand-father, foundryman. Dave's heart finally gave out and he passed away on October 20, 2009. While he was here though, he gave his heart to everyone around him in all he did for others, whether it was AFS, Junior Achievement, Boy Scouts, Auto Shows, Retirees Club, SMCO, Drapers; as a driver, treasurer, photographer or just being Dave.

David E. Proux was born in Saginaw, Michigan on January 13, 1936. Following graduation from high school, he served in the U.S. Air Force from 1954 to 1958, where he specialized in radio repair and was honorably discharged as an Airman First Class.

Following his military service, Dave attended Bay City Jr. College for one year, then transferred to General Motors Institute, graduating with a B.S. degree in Industrial Engineering in 1964. He began his General Motors career in 1959 at the Saginaw Grey Iron Foundry, where he held various positions in both manufacturing and engineering. He retired on August 30, 1991 as a Staff Assistant in Industrial Engineering.

Few people have given so unselfishly of their time and commitment to the Saginaw Valley Chapter of AFS. Many remember Mr. Proux as the man behind the camera at AFS functions, a service he provided for close to twenty years. Many others recognize him as a contributing member of one the Chapter's many committees. Still others know Dave as the Treasurer, a position he held since 1987. "Giving?" You bet! "Sacrifice?" In Spades!

Dave continued to remain active in not only AFS, but also in supporting Junior Achievement of Saginaw County through local firewood sales and weekly popcorn sales at the Saginaw Grey Iron Foundry. He and his wife (of nearly 50 years) Barbara's favorite activity of "spoiling" their four children and eight grandchildren.

2010 AFS Saginaw Valley Chapter Educational Seminars

The AFS Saginaw Valley Chapter's education seminars were held on February 11th, 18th and 25th, 2010 at the GM Powertrain Saginaw Metal Castings facility in Saginaw, Michigan. In attendance were GM salaried and retired employees, local college students from Saginaw Valley State University and representatives from local companies. The average attendance for the seminars was 27 attendees per session.

On Thursday February 11th, Don Brink and Jim Eigner GM Powertrain retirees gave a presentation on Metal Castings in the Civil War Era. The topic covered the castings that were manufactured in the foundry industry for both the North and the South.

On Thursday February 18th, Professor Charles White from Kettering University discussed the Metal Casting Industry in China. Professor White shared his insight and experiences from visiting a 19th century iron foundry in Shanghi. He discussed the Chinese university that he lectured at and shared his thoughts on their educational program. While in China he toured other manufacturing and fastening companies and he shared his insights on these also.

On Thursday, February 25th, Margaret Palardy and Allen Holmes from GM Hybrid Engineering gave a presentation on the hybrid technologies that will be used in the new Chevy Volt. In the second part of this session, Professor Robert Tuttle from Saginaw Valley State University (SVSU) talked about his foundry operations at this university. SVSU is one of the latest schools in the country to develop a metalcastings curriculum.
